

The Chapateca association aims at promoting access to books and reading among people in a vulnerable socio-economic situation. Its founding members are convinced that education is a fundamental right of every human being as well as a necessity to fulfil their personal development and their academic or professional success, with a view towards contributing to a more equitable society.

Almost **90%** of children entering primary school do not speak Portuguese! After three years of schooling, less than 5% are able to write it.

Barely **5%** of young people complete secondary education!

The situation in Mozambique is alarming:

- An illiteracy rate of **46%**, with great disparities between men (27.2%) and women (49.4%), urban and rural areas (18.8% vs. 50.7%)
- Limited access to books and information, with only **98** libraries in the country;
- Portuguese is the mother tongue of only **17%** of the population.




As a way of helping to change this situation, the association Chapateca plans to open **community-based libraries**, in partnership with local associations and community leaders, in the **suburban areas of Mozambique larger cities** with less access to educational infrastructures.

There will be two types of community-based libraries, both implementing the same activities:



Kayatecas and Chapatecas will operate on the same model: the facilitators will benefit from the same continuous training and the participants will receive the same interactive and inclusive assistance.

How to support our project?

The Chapateca association is looking for partners to support and/or finance the implementation of its activities:

- **Opening of Kayatecas:** renovation / rehabilitation of spaces including ceiling repair, electrical installation, replacement of sanitary ware or painting;
- **Creation of Chapatecas:** purchase of a chapa and transformation into a library;



- **Setting of Kayatecas/Chapatecas:** bookcases, tables and chairs for children and adults, fans, mats, cushions;
- **Equipment:** educational materials (children's books, comics, novels, magazines, dictionaries); school materials (stationery, writing tools).
